quickly from hut to hut in the camp where the Canadians are most likely to remain concentrated until their departure for home.

Twenty-six Canadians who were in hospital at the time of the liberation were taken aboard the hospital ship Oxfordshire which is to sail shortly for Melbourne. Last Sunday morning a second hospital ship, the former New Zealand passenger vessel Maugaui, drew into the harbor.

The Empress of Australia, a trans-Atlantic liner in peacetime, arrived at Hong Kong Tuesday with some 3,000 R.A.F. personnel including airfield construction groups. The men will temporarily join naval forces in the occupation of Hong Kong and the Kowloon area.
