First Canadians At Manila Pass Medical Tests

MANILA, Sept. 12 — (CP-Cable) — All of the 50 Canadian prisoners who were the first arrivals at the reception camp here for Allied personnel released from Japanese hands have passed the medical examinations which are one of the preliminaries to their transport homeward.

During the last 24 hours there have been only one or two Canadian newcomers to the camp although a large number is expected from the Hong Kong area.

More than 300 Canadian prisoners, freed from the Samshuipo camp outside Kowloon, on the mainland across from Hong Kong, are en route to Manila aboard the liner Empress of Australia.
