9,000 Prisoners Now Liberated

NAGASAKI, Sept. 22.—(AP)— The last of more than 9,000 British, Australian, Canadian, United States, Dutch and Javanese prisoners liberated from 17 camps on Kyushu will be evacuated today from this atom-blasted port of western Japan.

Into this port Friday came 367 of those survivors, and at least 1,000 more are expected today.

As fast as the survivors arrived are 8,256 prisoners, and 1,000 more

are expected from camp No. 5, Kawasaki, and camp 27, Ida, both near Fukuoka north of here. they were being placed aboard ship in harbor. Already liberated
