CITY MAN CHARGED IN HIT-RUN CASE

Philip Harder, 287 Wardlaw ave., alleged hit-and-run driver, has been charged with causing grievious bodily harm. In city police court today he was remanded until Oct. 1 without being asked to plead and bail was set at \$2,000.

Harder is accused of causing grievious harm to Mrs. Lois Sask-stone, ste. 6 Pacia blk., who was struck by a hit-and-run autoist while riding a bicycle on Osborne st. near Whitehall ave., at 9.30 p.m. Friday.

This accident occurred a few seconds after Mrs. Charlotte Mc-Connell, 154 Langside st., was struck by the same auto after alighting from a streetcar at Osborne st. and Broadway. Harder was arrested at his home Saturday morning.

More seriously hurt of the two women was Mrs. Saskstone, who was thrown against a lamp-post by the force of the collision, and sustained severe internal injuries as well as a fracture of the left leg. She is in General hospital where her condition is reported as very poor.

Mrs. McConnell, who suffered a compound fracture of the right leg, is also in General hospital. Her condition is reported as fair.
