11:02	O'Canada is performed by the Canadian Armed Forces band, accompanied by the Canadian Military Wives Choir.
11:04	MC invites <b>Elder Claudette Commanda</b> to welcome guests to the unceded, unsurrendered Territory of the Anishinaabe Algonquin Nation.
11:05	Elder Commanda provides a traditional welcome.
11:08	MC thanks <b>Elder Commanda</b> and delivers opening remarks, providing historical context on the 80 <sup>th</sup> anniversary of Victory in the Pacific and the end of the SWW.
11:10	MC invites guests to stand for the start of the commemoration.
11:11	Last Post is performed by a Canadian Armed Forces bugler.
11:13	Moment of Silence.
11:15	Rouse is performed by a Canadian Armed Forces bugler.
11:17	Lament is performed by a Canadian Armed Forces piper.
11:19	MC invites Colonel Philippe de Tanouarn and Jim Trick to recite the Act of Remembrance.
11:20	The Act of Remembrance is recited in English and French.
11:22	MC invites <b>Mary Tang</b> and <b>Delia Carver-Kronick</b> to recite the Commitment to Remember in French and English.
11:23	The Commitment to Remember is recited in English, French.
11:24	MC introduces Randy Wing and Julie Carver to recite the Prisoner of War Prayer.
11:25	The Prisoner of War Prayer is recited in French and English
11:26	MC invites Captain Mircea Daniel Banu, Canadian Armed Forces Chaplain, to deliver reflection.

12:02	MC delivers closing remarks and thanks participants. MC introduces the song <i>Never Grow Old</i> by Alan Sandeman as closing song (Song recording played through PA).
